
MOTORHOMES Characteristics & Use

An 'Autonomous Vehicle'
Onboard space & water heating by gas or diesel
heaters, 12v lighting, fresh water and wastewater
capacity sufficient for 3-4 days

Solar panels charge leisure batteries.



Importantly, it's parking, <u>not</u> camping - only white lines are required to begin with until the demand in a location is proven.

The services bay should only provide:

- Fresh water supply point
- Grey water disposal point
- Toilet (black water) disposal point.

The services bay need not be co-located with the parking area and may be provided at another location separate from the parking areas where water and drainage services are available and can easily accessed.

Other Parking Options Double up on usage of existing spaces where possible by allowing overnight parking and reverting to normal hourly charging during daytime - e.g. Galway docks, Waterford City and other locations.

Double up on use of existing spaces for events.

The average motorhome tourist's mature demographic supports extended leisure time. They are culturally curious, like to linger and discover and the key to maximizing their dwell time and spend in an area is to provide a necklace of stops relatively closely spaced – e.g. the 'Romantic Road' in Germany - http://www.romantischestrasse.de/index.php?id=159&L=0 - which has 19 stops over its 350 kms. Similar destination routes could be promoted in Ireland in areas possessed of multiple attractions, e.g. within Ireland's Ancient East, The Wild Atlantic Way and Lakelands & Inland Waterways.
